This was in full unanimous agreement of all parties and trustees. All contractual and grant obligations have been transferred from the Shropshire Deafness Association to Signal, in full agreement of all trustees of both charities.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Trustees

The trustees are the group of people charged with the governance of the charity. During the period no Trustee had any financial interest in the charity.

Method of appointment or election of trustees

The charity's board appoints the trustees of the charity. The Board meets at least three times a year. The Shropshire Deafness Association board, in appointing trustees, will ensure that the board contains trustees with adequate business, compliance and other relevant expertise.

Governing document

The Charity is constituted according to a Rules of Association dated 22nd July 1993.

Organisational structure

To oversee the operation of the charity, the board of Trustees employs a small management and administration team.

Volunteers

The organisation acknowledges with gratitude the work of its volunteers in both areas of fundraising and social media. Shropshire Deafness Association started to work closely with volunteers in the financial year, but this involvement has grown with now over 500 hours of their valuable time being dedicated to assisting our work.

Financial risk management objectives and policies

The trustees review the finances and associated risks at each trustee meeting.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

A New Dawn

In October 2013 Shropshire Deafness Association amalgamated with the Woodford Foundation (Charity Number:1105958) and formed Signal, Sensory Impairment Globally Nationally and Locally (Charity Number: 1151615). This new venture as Signal marks a drive forward to support and develop initiatives to build deaf friendly communities, both in the UK and overseas.

History and Mission

The Church Mission to the Deaf and Dumb in South Staffordshire and Shropshire was founded in 1856 and, in addition to its work in the Wolverhampton area, established two small centres in Shropshire. A Missioner conducted church services and visited Deaf people. In 1955, the organisation purchased Brierley House in Shrewsbury as a centre for Deaf social and church activities and an assistant missioner was appointed to serve the local Deaf community. In 1963, a local committee -The Shropshire Christian Association With Deaf People (SCAD) - was established to oversee the delivery of services in Shropshire, although a single trustee body remained responsible for both Shropshire and Wolverhampton. However, in 1993 it was decided that each area would operate separately and SCAD became an independent charity in its own right. In 2002 Brierley House was sold and the income used to support its charitable activities.

Shropshire Deafness Association's Values

Shropshire Deafness Association's main values have always been to work in partnership and co-operation, to seek understanding of the issues facing our client group and to deliver services that meet the expressed needs.

Public benefit report

We have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing our aims and objectives and in planning our future activities.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable operational activity has remained at the same level in this period.

Our outreach worker continues to meet the needs of our clients. The outreach service has worked with around 25 clients during the year. The work has ranged from taking clients shopping to assisting vulnerable, at risk clients in reporting cases of abuse. The service continues to develop in terms of scale and professionalism.

As an organisation much of the work during the year has revolved around research and building up links with local voluntary and statutory groups. This planning period has allowed the development of medium and long term strategic plans for Shropshire Deafness Association in its new guise as the UK branch of Signal. Additionally several smaller pilot projects have been identified and will be launched under Signal's remit.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Results

The Statement of Financial Activities on page 7 shows total incoming resources of £14,079 and net outgoing resources for the period of £39,005.

Reserves policy

It is the trustees' policy to ensure that we maintain a readily realisable reserve sufficient to cover three months of overhead costs.

Investment policy

Funds are invested with the diocese of Lichfield - this policy is reviewed annually.

Financial Support

The Association does not receive support other than a small grant from the diocese of Lichfield.

PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS MOVING FORWARD

In early 2013 the trustees decided that to move the charity forward and merge with the Woodford Foundation to create a new charity. The incorporated charity Signal, Sensory Impairment Globally Nationally and Locally (Charity Number 1151615) was created in April 2013. Shropshire Deafness Association officially amalgamated/merged with Signal in October 2013, following a launch and rebranding exercise.

In connection with my examination, no matter has come to my attention:

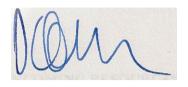
